### AOC/AOP Regulations

- **Département:** Côte d'Or
- **Communes of Production:** Beaune
- **Styles and Encépagement:**
  - Blanc: Chardonnay and Pinot Blanc, plus a max. 10% Pinot Gris
  - Rouge: Pinot Noir, plus a max. 15% mixed plantings of Pinot Gris, Pinot Blanc, and Chardonnay
  - Blanc/Rouge "Premier Cru"
- **Assemblage:** For Blanc wines, Pinot Gris may not exceed 30% of the blend.
- **Minimum Potential Alcohol:**
  - Blanc: 11%
  - Rouge: 10.5%
  - Blanc "Premier Cru": 11.5%
  - Rouge "Premier Cru": 11%
- **Minimum Must Weight:**
  - Blanc: 178 g/l (170 g/l prior to 2011)
  - Rouge: 180 g/l (171 g/l prior to 2011)
  - Blanc "Premier Cru": 187 g/l (178 g/l prior to 2011)
  - Rouge "Premier Cru": 189 g/l (180 g/l prior to 2011)
- **Maximum Residual Sugar:**
  - Blanc: 3 g/l
  - Rouge: 2 g/l
- **Élevage:** Wines may not be released until June 30 of the year following the harvest
- **Minimum Planting Density:** 9,000 vines per hectare
- **Maximum Yields (Rendement de Base):**
  - Blanc: 57 hl/ha (45 hl/ha prior to 2011)
  - Rouge: 50 hl/ha (40 hl/ha prior to 2011)
  - Blanc "Premier Cru": 55 hl/ha (45 hl/ha prior to 2011)
  - Rouge "Premier Cru": 48 hl/ha (40 hl/ha prior to 2011)

Le Clos des Mouches	25.18 ha	Drouhin	archaic French dialect for "honey fly", in reference to the bees in the vineyard

Les Sizies	8.58 ha	Bouchard	named after historic owner, Renaud de Sesie
Les Aigrots	18.64 ha		derives from <i>aigre</i> , French for "sour"
Pertuisots	5.27 ha	Domaine des Croix	derives from archaic French word, <i>pertuis</i> , a "hole"
Clos Saint-Landry	1.98 ha	Bouchard, monopole	
Les Avaux	11.52 ha	Louis Jadot, Champy	"vaux" = "valley"
Les Tuvilains	8.94 ha	Bouchard	"tue" = "kill"; the vineyard was hard to work
Belissand	4.88 ha	Bouchard	in reference to humid or damp soils
Les Seurey	1.23 ha	Bouchard	
Clos de la Mousse	3.37 ha	Bouchard, monopole	"mousse" = "moss"; in reference to damp soils

Les Reversés	4.78 ha	Jean-Marc Bouley	derived from <i>renverse</i> , French for a downward slope

Les Teurons	21.04 ha	Château de Chorey, Bouchard, Louis Jadot	from <i>turno</i> , for slight elevation or small hill
Clos de Roi	8.41 ha	Camus-Bruchon, Robert Ampeau	vineyard belonging to the king
Blanches Fleurs	0.36 ha		"white flowers"; many orchard trees once in this vineyard
A l'Ecu	2.65 ha		Ecu was a currency in the Middle ages
Clos de l'Ecu	2.37 ha	Faiveley, monopole	
Les Fèves	4.42 ha	Chanson, monopole	derives from the archaic French <i>faie</i> , or "beech tree"
Les Cents Vignes	23.50 ha	Vincent Bitouzet, Château de Chorey, Louis Jadot	named after a hamlet
Les Marconnets	9.39 ha	Albert Morot, Remoissenet	named after a fountain
En Genêt	4.34 ha		named after a small river
En l'Orme	2.02 ha		"orme" = "elm tree"
Les Perrières	3.20 ha	François Gay	a quarry
Les Bressandes	16.97 ha	Louis Jadot, Albert Morot, Remoissenet, Henri Germain	refers to historic owner, Jean Bressans
Les Toussaints	6.42 ha	Louis Jadot, Remoissenet	"tous" = "every", every saint, in connection to a chapel on the property
Les Grèves	31.33 ha	Château de Chorey, Louis Jadot, Joseph Drouhin	named after a sandy field
Sur les Grèves	2.90 ha

Aux Cras	5.00 ha	Château de Chorey	derives from <i>craie</i> , or "chalk"
